



COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

August 19th, 2021

PRESENT: Stan Kumpula, Joni Kumpula, Heidi Hoppe, Don Hoppe, Pastor Torri, Tom Cox, Mike Bohanon, Karen Holle, Sue Johnson, Mary Parrish, Caryl Allan, Jo Horak

Mike Bohanon called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone. Pastor Torri offered a convening prayer. The agenda was approved with two additions. Stan/Mary. The minutes of the last meeting were approved as written. Tom/Heidi

Pastor's Monthly Report: Pastor Torri will be starting a new book study on September 15. A list of possible books has been put together for review by anyone interested in looking it over. She is also planning to start a Bible Study in September based on Brian McLaren's book, "We Make the Road by Walking."

Pastor Torri requested that office hours at church be Monday through Thursday from 9 – noon instead of from 9 – 2 those days. She will cover on Monday, and Linda O will cover T – Th. Torri wants to be free to do other things from noon – 2 four days a week and not to have to be in the office. This motion, to change office hours from 9-2 four days a week to 9-noon four days a week was passed by Council. Tom/Stan. A new sign will be made for the church door.

Board of Financial Stewardship: Don reported that the church's donation/giving for the rest of 2021 may be low for meeting the budget. Less than projected non-pledge giving and non completion of pledges is a concern. At this point all boards except Facilities are under budget. The August mission is Stewardship. At this time we have received 11 pledges for a total of \$26,215 for 2022.

Facilities Board: Mike reported that a few repair requests have been received by the Board of Facilities and have been taken care of. Kerry Swenson is very handy and has agreed to help with future church maintenance projects. A drop box has been ordered and received and will be installed outside the north door of the church for dropping off small items. Cindy and Heidi have been weeding outside the church and welcome help with the project.

Personnel Board: Pastor Torri reported that Sabbastian and Linda will now be equally splitting the 20 hour per week office secretary's job. This will allow Linda to be in the office from 9:00 to noon Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday each week.

Ministry Team Reports: Congregational Life: Joni reported that this team will meet the fourth Thursday of each month from 9:15 – 10:15. The team is calling people who might be in need of support from the church. Karen reported that she and Don are working on a new directory of members and friends that can be distributed. Mike would like to see a directory with pictures. No one volunteered to take on that task. Karen also reviewed a list of new people who are attending church at Union so that we know "who's new in the pew."

Worship: Heidi is concerned about the condition of the Altar Bible which is falling apart and needs to either be replaced or repaired. In the meantime we will use a Bible that belongs to Torri for the Altar Bible.

The Minnesota Conference has sent out guidelines that they will be following as a result of the recent resurgence of Covid-19. The Conference is reinstating the use of masks and social distancing at their events and will not be serving food at events that are less than 4 hours in duration.

Council talked about whether we want to make masks mandatory for church services and whether we want to continue to have social hour after worship. We agreed that at this time we will encourage masks but will not require them in-

side the building. Because coffee hour is so important to the congregation, we will continue to have coffee and fellowship after services. People need to decide for themselves if they are comfortable having coffee and conversation with others.

Women's Fellowship: Joni felt the housewarming party at Torri's new house was really nice. This event was sponsored by the Women's Fellowship. The next meeting will be in September and will include a fun activity.

Men's Fellowship: Stan reported that at the last men's fellowship meeting Gary Wadzink presented information on TRIAD which was very informative. Stan is working on presentations for future Men's Fellowship meetings.

Christian Learning: Jo talked about the next Christian Learning event which is Adult and Teen Challenge on August 29. After the event there will be a brunch served in the Friendship Hall. Anyone interested in helping prepare the food on August 28 or serving on August 29 will be welcomed.

Morning Out: Sue Johnson would like to start the Morning Out Program up again on September 10. She and Donna Foust are willing to work as unpaid volunteers for the month of September while we see if there is community interest in the program. Council agreed to this proposal as long as background checks are in place for the adult volunteers.

Community Meal: The Community Meal is scheduled to begin again on September 8 at 5:00. Food will be prepared in the upstairs kitchen, and people will be encouraged to sit in family groups in the Friendship Hall. People can also come into the church to request a take-out meal, but we will not be able to bring food to people's cars.

Justice Ministry Team: Tom reported that the Joy Persall forum went well a few weeks ago. Tentatively September 12 is being held as a possible forum for the Leech Lake Culture Alliance, but Tom is not sure if that will happen. The focus of the Leech Lake Culture Alliance is to develop friendships between the Native American and White communities. A potluck is being sponsored by the Culture Alliance on September 21. It will be held at the Onigum Community Center, and we are all being encouraged to attend.

Outreach: Karen reported that the July mission for Paws and Claws went well. One hundred and fifty dollars and a trunk load of food, toys, and blankets were taken to the shelter. Staff at Paws and Claws were very pleased! The mission for August and September is Church Stewardship.

Moderator: Mike is encouraging people to get their reports out for Council meetings several days early so that the meetings can move more quickly. He does not want people reading their reports at the monthly Council meetings.

Old Business: Streaming church services – Don reported that the technology team has determined how to improve the quality of the streamed church service. Next, they will order the equipment needed and put the new system together. \$9,000 was approved by Council for this project with \$3,600 already having been spent. We discussed giving Mike Schmidt, a friend of the Kumpulas, a gift card for helping us with this project.

New Business: Pastor Torri is working with Chris and Kerry Swenson on a new Policy and Procedure for Youth and Vulnerable Adults. A rough copy of the new policy will be available for discussion at the September Council meeting.

Executive Committee: Our current Constitution describes the Executive Committee as consisting of: The Minister, the Moderator, the Clerk, and the Vice Moderator. A motion was offered to include the Chairman of the Board of Financial Stewardship to the Executive Committee. Joni/Heidi. This motion passed.

As we approach September and our fall season, the nights are cooler and the days not as hot. We also have had some rain which makes us and nature happy.

In August, we began our Stewardship Campaign for 2022 with the theme **"The Journey from Gratitude to Generosity."** We continue the campaign into September.

We would like to thank Caryl Allan, Steve Erickson, and Joni Kumpula for sharing Stewardship Moments during worship on the last few Sundays.

As of the writing of this article, we have received 15 pledges for a total of \$33,235. We thank everyone that has pledged so far. However, last year at this time we had received 23 pledges. We hope that you will prayerfully consider what Union Church means to you and this community, and pledge generously. We would like to have the pledge cards in by September 26. The Board of Financial Stewardship in its report to the Church Council at the August meeting noted that August income will be significantly less than last year and will continue to be behind the 2020 level. 
