# **UNEXPECTED GIFTS**

Several years ago, I was working at a church as a youth director. One of the members was a widow named Elayne and she had a cat named "Chewy". It was not in my job description, but every few months I would go to her home and clip Chewy's nails so he wouldn't rip up her furniture.

One winter, Elayne made a decision to go into a living assistance apartment. She needed to downsize her belongings and was having a hard time parting with certain items. It was near Christmas time, so she decided to gift some of her possessions to friends, neighbors and members of our church staff.

Elayne wanted to give me something special and close to her heart. She loved cats and thought is was nice of me to help her take care of Chewy. So, one day she walked into my office with a box that rattled and clanked. She was careful not to bend it and walked gingerly across the room to set it on a chair. She then said, "I wanted to thank you for taking such good care of Chewy. You are very special to me. I wish I could have wrapped this, but I didn't have any paper. It is your Christmas gift!"

She stuck her hand in the box and pulled out a mug... a cat mug! It stood about 4.5 inches high and held about 6-8 oz. Printed on the side was cleverly animated cats doing crazy cat-like things such as pouncing or hiding. The handle as sculpted like a cat tail and there was a theme written on the inside lip... "On the Prowl". It was cute.

I took the gift from her hand and thanked her for thinking of me. Then she said, "The rest of them or in the box! They are all for you!"

I tried not to look ungrateful or apprehensive, so I smiled and said, "The rest?".

"Yes!" She said, "There are 14 more!" I looked in the box and sure enough... there were 14 more cat mugs staring at me from the box. All different and unique with their own theme.



My first thought was, "What am I going to do with 15 cat mugs?" But my thoughts were interrupted by her next words, "These have been special to me and I wanted you to have them. Merry Christmas!"

I graciously accepted the box of cat mugs and thanked her for her generosity and kindness. I took the box home, unpacked the cat mugs and put them on one of my kitchen shelves. A few days later, I wanted to make myself a cup of hot chocolate. I thought of the cat mugs sitting in my cupboard and used one of them. Then the next week I wanted hot cider and I used another one, but this time I went through the themes and chose one that fit my mood. I found

myself going back to those cat mugs every time I wanted something to drink... and I thought of my friend Elayne and her cat Chewy.

Over the years, these quirky little mugs have brought me many smiles. I have used them on cold winter nights when I snuggled up with a cup of hot chocolate and a movie, I have used them during bonfire nights when I invited friends over, and I have used them when I have just a few friends over for dinner. They have become conversation pieces and a chance to share about my friend Elayne and her cat Chewy.

Elayne passed away this past year. Chewy passed away a few years earlier, but their memory and story have been engraved on my heart through 15 oddly creative cat mugs. They were an unexpected gift that has helped me remember my friends.

Some of the best gifts are unexpected. When I think about the Advent and Christmas season, I often think about how God gave us the unexpected gift of Jesus Christ. Who would have thought that the Messiah would be born from such humble beginnings? His family did not have money or prestige. He was part of a carpenter's family. But Jesus was unique. #### Council Minutes – November 21, 2019

Council PRESENT: Sabbastian Wilson-Webb, Tom Cox, Mary Parrish, Heidi Hoppe, Don Hoppe, Mike Bohanon, Ron Merritt, Joni Kumpula, Karen Holle (Pastor Torri was ill today)

Joni called the meeting to order and offered a convening prayer.

The agenda was approved as written. Heidi/Mary. The minutes were approved as written. Ron/Tom.

<u>Pastor's Monthly Report:</u> Don reported that he and Torri had purchased a phone that could be used as the church's emergency phone, but that he planned to return it and use an old smart phone which would save us money. Joni indicated that she has an old phone she would donate. This phone would be used for church emergencies when Torri is not available. In Torri's monthly report she talked about meetings she has attended, people she has met and the results of our first Trivia Night. Eight teams participated in Trivia Night and a total of \$640 was earned for men's and women's fellowship outreach projects. Torri also mentioned that the technical aspect of the church service has become a bit more complicated due to the projection and video camera. We are looking for people who are willing to push buttons. There is minimal or no technical experience necessary to help with this.

Pastor Torri also wanted the Council to know how important she feels the Community meal is on Wednesday evenings. These meals are important opportunities for relationships to develop as we get to know people in our local community.

Torri also wanted people to be aware of a recent article from the Open and Affirming Coalition of the United Church of Christ. This article talks about the growth that has occurred in some ONA churches, specifically the ones that integrate its ONA commitment into its vision, identity and priorities. Karen will send the article to all members of Council who would like to read it.

Financial Stewardship: Don reported that as of the end of October 2019 church income is \$139,036 and expenses are \$119,039 leaving a balance of \$19,513. However we just learned that we owe the MN. Conference for Torri's annuity \$6,860. Once this bill is paid we will have a positive balance of \$12,653.

Don's team has been working on the 2020 budget. At this time the projected income for 2020 is not as high as the projected expenses. The team has more work to do to get these numbers finalized. The budget will be presented to Council at the January meeting and our semi-annual congregational meeting will be January 26, 2020.

**Facilities Board:** Ron reported that Advantage Heating recently looked at all our furnaces – 4 of which are 20 years old. One furnace is starting to rust out and will probably be the next to be replaced. A new furnace costs about \$8,000.

Council members signed a card for Julie Rono and made donations to a gift for her in thanks for her years of service to the church.

<u>Ministry teams: Congregational Life:</u> Karen reported that at our last Congregational Life meeting the team decided that we don't want to hire a parish nurse at this time. We feel we are capable of calling on and transporting our members that need assistance. If you would like to call people or would like to be called please let Pastor Torri or Karen know. Don indicated that he does not feel we have up-to-date emergency contact information in the Church Windows program. We will begin asking for this information in order to get our records more accurate in case of an emergency.

**Worship:** Heidi mentioned that we are scheduled to worship in the Sanctuary until the last Sunday of December when we will meet in the Friendship Hall for a hymn sing Sunday service. We will stay in the Friendship Hall for most of the winter. Heidi is scheduling both Cheri Westphal and Sheri Ford to speak about Food Shelf needs sometime this winter.

<u>Women's Fellowship</u>: The Christmas dinner is scheduled for Dec. 5 this year and is open to all members and friends of the church. The meal will be catered by Birchwood Char House. Please sign up if you want to participate in this event. On December 8 there will be a Christmas cookie sale after church to benefit the Women's Fellowship. All 6" plates of goodies sell for \$1.50! This is a real bargain so bring your checkbooks!

<u>Men's Fellowship</u>: The men are working on the Thanksgiving food boxes on Monday, Nov. 25. On December 3 the men will set up the church Christmas trees. Come and help with either project if you are able.

<u>Christian Learning</u>: Jo reported that on December 8 the youth will perform a Christmas program for us called The Heart of Christmas. They will also be serving cookies that they will bake on Dec. 7. Come and help with the baking if you have time on Saturday. Special musicians will be part of the program on the 8<sup>th</sup>.

Scholarship ministry team: Jo is requesting applicants for our 2020 youth scholarship program. She also will be scheduling the 2019 recipients to speak at a worship service this winter about their college adventures and to thank the church for the scholarships they received.

Jo is interested in having some of her volunteers trained in CPR this winter so there is always someone around that knows how to treat a child injury in case of an accident.

The Community meal is cancelled for the Christmas season, except for December 11 when we will have a turkey dinner at the church. The program will re-start in January.

<u>Moderator Moment:</u> Joni mentioned that we still need our service time added to each of our new church signs. She also mentioned that the Solstice Concert will be at the church December 19 and will be part concert and part sing along. Free will offerings will be accepted. The church will do the printing for the concert at no cost.

# FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

The Church has begun working on our 2020 budget. The preliminary council, board, and ministry team requests are in, and we have calculated the expected revenue. The Board of Financial Stewardship presented their preliminary figures to the Church Council at their November meeting, and at this point proposed expenses are over \$4000 more than expected revenue.

Thank you to everyone who has made a pledge to our 2020 Stewardship Campaign. If you haven't yet pledged, we ask that you get it in as soon as possible so that we have the best estimates of our expected revenue for 2020. If you have misplaced or did not receive pledging information, please contact the Financial Secretary by mail to the Union Church address, email to <u>finsec.ucc@gmail.com</u>, or call 218-839-4341. We will be happy to send information out to you or answer your questions.

Our current position of revenue versus expenses for 2019 is very good, and we are expecting to have a good carryover of funds into 2020. This carryover is included in our 2020 revenue calculation; therefore, it is extremely important that persons complete their 2019 pledges by the end of the year so that we can finish off 2019 in a good financial position and have the expected carryover for next year.

As I write this message we are approaching Thanksgiving. Please take time to consider what Union Church means to you and the wider community. Please, prayerfully consider a special year-end gift or an increase in your pledge or giving for next year.



#### **Breakfast with Santa**




