### FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

### Union Church in this time of Distancing and Separation

As we move through this period of concern, separation, change, and uncertainty, we know that we should not be gathering in close proximity to one another, but that does not mean we are not still the church. Union Church is different right now – very few gatherings, meetings, or comings and goings at the church building. I just looked at the church calendar for April as it was planned and programmed, and I realize how the COVID-19 pandemic has changed how we are doing our ministry and how much things have changed.

April was a busy time for Pastor Torri. Lenten, Holy Week, Palm Sunday, Easter and regular Sunday services. Preparing for these worship times, calling people, meeting, sometimes electronically, with church boards and ministry team, practicing the music that she was using in worship, and studying, thinking, and praying about how Union Church can and will adjust to the new normal.

We continue to prepare and send out our newsletter, we broadcast our worship services on Facebook Live and then edit and post them on the Union Church website. The Church Council, Boards and Ministry Teams meet and plan and keep the church functioning and preparing for the future. Persons call and deliver items to church member and friends.

The Community Meal program continues but has changed and increased. Meals are now prepared for about 60 persons. These are picked up curbside or in some cases delivered by volunteers. There is a core of 3 or 4 people who do all the work. Many more have volunteered to help, but for safety and distancing reasons, it has been decided that this is how this ministry should be done.

As you can see, Union Church is not "closed", it is just different and feels a little strange. We continue to pay our Pastor and staff to keep the church running.

Since I am writing this as Chair of the Board of Financial Stewardship, I will let you know what we are doing and thinking about at this time.

- The Church Council approved an application for a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loan. This was completed and submitted on April 20. This loan will hopefully be approved and give Union some relief for payroll expenses for an 8 week period.
- We are looking at and concerned about the effects that social distancing and the long-term uncertainty of the corona virus will have on the financial situation of Union Church.
- We are exploring options by which we can increase the earning potential of reserve funds currently held in low-earning savings accounts and CD's, while limiting risk.
- We now have a "Donate" button on our website and links to it on our Facebook page. Persons can now make credit card or PayPal account donations. We hope that this will be used by those that are seeing our online worship and viewing our website and Facebook page. Because of fees charged, this should not be used to pay pledges or sustained giving.

How can you donate to Union Church, without being physically at Union Church? There are numerous of ways to do this:

### COUNCIL MEETING - APRIL 16, 2020

PRESENT by ZOOM: Tom Cox, Karen Holle, Joni Kumpula, Torri Vande Zande, Don Hoppe, Caryl Allen, Mike Bohanon, Heidi Hoppe, Ron Merritt, Sarah Cox, Linda Merritt, Sabbastian Wilson-Webb.

Joni called the meeting to order. Pastor Torri offered a convening prayer. The agenda was approved as written. Minutes of the last meeting were approved as written.

<u>Pastor's Monthly Report</u>: Torri\_reported that she has been connecting with people via Facebook, phone calls, and Zoom. She and several others went to Burton's house earlier this month to sing to him on his birthday and to offer birthday wishes. Several of our congregation do not have internet and cannot listen to services. We are all concerned about staying connected with these people during the coronavirus pandemic.

Torri will probably move services from her home back to the sanctuary where the internet service is better and where there will not be background street noise to contend with. Torri is also interested in getting game nights and other activities going again – perhaps with the help of Zoom. Torri will also use the Library entrance to her office so that she is not coming in contact with people in the church office.

<u>Financial Stewardship Board</u>: Don reported that we have received the Fetzer grant of \$12,000. This money has been deposited in our operating budget and brings us to a total income this year of \$51,652. Don expects between \$11,000 and \$12,000 to come in to the church in April. Our expenses this year so far are \$34,805.

Food shelf donations: A total of \$5,976 was collected during March for the food shelves. Walker food shelf received \$1465 and the Hackensack food shelf received \$4,511.

Don is working on having a PayPal account so that we can have a donate button on our website. The cost per donation is 30 cents per transaction and 2.2% of the donation goes to PayPal. This is the lowest cost option for us to encourage donations on-line to the church.

PPP Loan: Don presented information to the Council about The Paycheck Protection Program — a program which makes for-givable loans to small businesses to pay their employees during the COVID-19 crisis. The loan proceeds will be forgiven as long as the monies are used to cover payroll costs, utilities, rent or mortgage interest as long as employee and compensation levels are maintained. Union Church as a faith based organization qualifies and can apply for this loan. Applications are made to our local bank. Currently the money for this program has all been used, but more money may be designated from the Federal Government for this project. Don would like to apply for a \$11,153 loan that could be entirely forgiven, or might need to be paid back at an extremely low interest rate. The loan provides a safety net for the church during this difficult time.

Don moved to apply for a PPP loan through the Cares Act. Tom seconded/passed. Don also will move \$20,000 of money in our savings account into the stock market. Tom/Ron/passed.

<u>Facilities</u>: Ron reported that the church incurred roof leaks in February and April due to snow and ice melting which caused ice dams and water damage to the inside of the building. We have a quote of \$7,320 to add insulation in some areas of the roof and to improve air flow by venting the soffits that surround the Sanctuary. Ron is also concerned that we have four heating and air conditioning systems that are 20 years old and are beginning to rust out. We have an estimate of \$18,520 to replace furnaces #6 and #7 which heat the Music Room and Library. The other two furnaces are electronically operated and serve the Friendship Hall. We do not have a quote for the replacement of these furnaces yet.

Council authorized Ron to move forward on the replacement of the furnaces #6 and #7. Don indicated that we have the funds in our reserve MRI account for that project. Council also authorized Ron to have the soffit and insulation work done on the roof as soon as it can be done.

<u>Personnel Board</u>: Pastor Torri feels she and Sabbastian are working well together, despite the fact that they are both working remotely. Sabbastian has time for more work and Don suggested a project organizing the music that is stored in the music room. Don will talk to Sabbastian about the project.

<u>Ministry Team Reports: Worship</u>: Pastor Torri is adding a service on Wednesday evenings that will start after Easter.

<u>Women's Fellowship</u>: Linda discussed the possibility of "visiting" folks by driving over in separate cars to the homes of folks that would be willing to sit outside and visit from a distance. She also thinks we could continue our blanket project in the

Friendship Hall and maintain social distancing.

<u>Christian Learning:</u> Jo was not present at this meeting as she was having trouble with the Zoom program. She sent her information by e-mail. A decision on whether or not to have Vacation Bible Schools will be made by May 1st. Other churches have re-scheduled or cancelled programs for this summer. At today's meeting Council passed a recommendation that VBS not be held this year due to concerns about the coronavirus. Don/Heidi

The Treasure Sale scheduled for June 10-13 to overlap with Sacred Heart Vendor Sale could be rescheduled. Organizers at Sacred Heart are not yet sure the June date will happen. The July 8th date is more likely. If we rescheduled our sale to coincide with the July date we could have more prep time and also benefit from Sweetheart Days visitors.

Scholarship Ministry Team has received several applications for our scholarship and will make a decision by May 1st.

Community Meals Pick-up and Delivery Program is running well. To date we have supplied 235 meals to families, elders, and home bound. Thanks to Team Members Sue, Mike, Jo, Don, and Caryl and Pastor Torri. Approximately \$1,000 to date in donations may enable us to provide service until end of May. This is an example of Christian Love in action!

- 2. Set up a scheduled electronic fund transfer payment of pledge or donation amount through you bank or credit union. Talk to them and fill out ACH form and get it signed by the church.
- 3. Talk to your bank or credit union about Check Free or Bill Pay services that they have.
- 4. Make payment of pledge, donations, or gifts from your IRA, 401(K) or other retirement saving plans. You can make donations, tax free to you, to Union Church from these accounts. Such payments are usually made on semi-annual or annual basis. This type of donation also counts toward you RMD amount. (These donations cannot also be included in deductions on your taxes.)

We hope that you stay healthy and safe and look forward to the time when we can return to being closer together. But we also know that this pandemic will have a continuing effect and ramifications on how we will be the church in the future. Let us be open to and embrace these changes.

3. My human feeds me healthy things. I have lost 4 pounds since we have been home more. But boy do I miss treats!


4. My human takes me for walks once or twice a day. I like to be outside whenever I can.

### Celebrating the Past - Myra Damm, historian

### Hackensack History - The Beginning

In the Hackensack 100 year history book, I found this information about early, early Hackensack and our church forming.

Here are some excerpts from the Hackensack book:

When Lathrop died around 1896, some of the residents moved to Hackensack, In 1902 James Curo and Bye Bartlett settled here and succeeded in getting Hackensack on the map of the area. Legend has it they named the town after Hackensack, New Jersey because the mosquitos were as numerous and big as those in their hometown. In 1904 William J. Spain Sr., surveyor made the first plat of Hackensack. This is also the year the train depot was moved from Lothrop to Hackensack. This is the year the congregational church started meeting in local homes. By 1907 they were officially organized. They were meeting in the Otterson hotel.

Most of our "oldtimers" came during a surge of pioneers from 1911 to 1920. It is also the time when the other "original" churches got started. Sacred Heart Catholic Church began meeting in Charlie wood's hotel and warehouse around 1910. St. Paul's began meeting in homes about the same time.

Union Congregational built the first church in 1917, Scared Heart built their church in 1919, as St. Paul's built their first building in the same year.

The major occupations of the day were logging, lumber milling, fur farming, sheep farming and selling cream to a dairy in Duluth.

There is more information about our early years in the church section of this history.

The Team is kept small to make it easier to observe social distancing. We hug you in our hearts, though.

Since the need is great, we plan to continue the Community Meal Program to the end of May this year. Thank you all for your donations to this mission work of Union Church. It makes it possible to let the Light shine in our world!

### **Treasure Sale Reschedules for July**

### **Scholarship Ministry Team**

Union Church has sponsored awards to graduating seniors for college or other higher educational expenses for many years. All seniors are eligible.

Two \$1,000 awards are given based on applications by students. An Announcement of Award will be made in Spring 2020. However, actual funds are not distributed until the student has completed a first quarter, semester, or other time frame at an accepted institution. A GPA of 2.0 or above is needed. Because of unusual circumstances due to COVID-19, many schools are still working on ceremony plans. Union Church will work with those institutions in the awards process. Prayers go to all students and school staff in the educational system now. Special blessings to parents and family at this time as well.

### **VBS Space Explorers Cancelled**

After much discussion, we regret the June VBS program will not be held this year. Materials and activities are to be carried over to 2021. A wonderful VBS plan had been developed but we can make it even stronger by next year. The Program usually ends at 8th grade. However, youth entering 8th grade this year will have an extra, one-time year of eligibility to join the 2021 VBS.


