Notes from Rev. Torri Vande Zande Union 101

I became part of the United Church of Christ about 10 years ago. I resonated with the theology and way of doing justice, but I really didn't know much about the UCC. Where did they come from? What do they believe? How do they function?

I decided to become a MID (Member in Discernment), which meant I was seeking to figure out where I belonged in ministry. I knew I was called to ministry, but where did I fit in? Through the MID process I realized

I fit in? Through the MID process I realized that God was leading me to become an ordained minister.



There were a number of things I needed to do for my ordination process including serving as a chaplain in a hospital, writing an ordination paper, being interviewed by The Committee on Ministry several times, and taking a course called "History and Polity of the UCC." The "History and Polity" class was my biggest challenge. I needed to learn how to function in a very different system than what I was used to in the Reformed and Assemblies of God denominations. I was a bit comforted by knowing that the form of governance was similar to an organization I worked with right out of college called

Youth for Christ, but having the structure of church was a whole new animal to me.

I studied, asked questions, and began understanding how the United Church of Christ functions on the local, conference, and the national levels. It was a big learning curve for me, but now I understand not only how the UCC functions, but why it functions like it does.

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES (DRAFT)

JULY 17, 2025 (Minutes are not yet approved by the council)

Present: Gunder Austin, Don and Heidi Hoppe, Mike and Connie Schmitt, Caryl Allan, Marilyn Mcknight, Steve Erickson, Mike Bohanon, Linnea Dietrich, Pastor Torri, Joni Kumpula, and Mary Parrish. Guest: Lynn Van Allen.

The meeting was called to order by Co-Moderator Marilyn. Pastor Torri led us in prayer.

There were changes to the Agenda regarding Fundraising and Outreach. Connie/Don/passed unanimously

Minutes were approved as presented. Gunder/Mary/passed unanimously

Pastor's Monthly Report: Pastor Torri presented her monthly report. We are finishing up the series on James. Next will come a series on generosity, then we will be digging into the Gospel of Matthew.

- Children's Ministry will begin in September.
 - Teachers will have training through our "Children, Youth and Vulnerable Adult" policy, will have a background check, and will sign a code of conduct.

BOARD TEAM REPORTS

Board of Facilities (Mike B.)

- Roof must be done by next year for sure
- Pew Removal Kerry will remove tomorrow, July 18th.
- Friendship Hall Foundation repair no update. Waiting to hear from WSN
- Shelving in Storage Room: New shelving will be installed in the near future. Mike S volunteered to help
- New Doors no update

Board of Financial Stewardship (Don)

- June figures are lower than expected: June Income \$11,764, Expenses \$13,140, and balance \$-1,375. Year-to-date balance \$-8,790. Year-to-date balance including prepaid & carryover +\$5,948
- The roof repair capital campaign will begin soon...
- Erickson Mediation lease will begin in August.
- Child Care Lease: Steve met with Ashley and Katy Chase (Child Care Board) regarding Child Care rent. The \$1,000 monthly rent originally suggested by the state non-profit organization may have been overly optimistic for out-state Minnesota. Ashley's suggestion of \$600/month is more realistic. Mike S recommended keeping rent and the cost of the internet separate. Motion: Charge \$600 (6 or less children) or \$700 (7+) per month. Connie/Gunder/approved with 1 nay vote. Motion: Ashley to supply washer and dryer, and we pay for installation (Lions have approximately \$500 from Pancake Breakfast donations). Steve will follow up with Ashley on the changes requested by the council. This will need to be confirmed once Ashley is in agreement with our comments. Linnea/Gunder Passed Unanimously.
- Mike S gave a presentation on the Solar Array update. It should be up and running and signed-off by Minnesota Power by August 3.

Board of Personnel (Connie)

• Children's Ministry background checks are in the works.

Summary

Income and expenses for June were a little low.

In consultation with the Investment Advisory group, \$40,000 from Bequest & Specials Gifts, from a CD that came due in May, is in checking and will be used as a short-term loan for the completion of the solar project and repaid with the receipt of the grants and refunds for the array.

The site prep for the Solar Array was done in June and the solar array is nearly completed and will be functioning by the first week of August.

New exterior doors on the west and north of the upper level will be replaced and paid for by money in the Reserve MRI fund.

A capital campaign to cover expenses for the re-shingling of the church will be started this year.

Our giving revenue for 2025 is low. Please complete your 2025 pledges or projected giving amounts before the end of year.

In August or early September, Union Church will begin it's 2026 Stewardship Campaign.


NEWS FROM THE WORSHIP MINISTRY TEAM




