Notes from Rev. Torri Vande Zande Dare we ask?

A group of us from church finished our "Union 101" class this past Monday night. In the last class, I teach the history of Union Congregational United Church of Christ. This little Northwoods church started out in the Otterson Hotel as a Sunday School that met each week. It began July 28, 1899. The attendance averaged 85 people. Can you believe that?

This group of people came together because they thought spirituality was important. They had different beliefs, different ways of worship, and came from different faith traditions, but they came together because they believed it was essential to have a faith community.

Hackensack was established as a town in 1903, and our church was organized and established in 1908. Can you believe our church is 117 years old? And in 2028, we celebrate 120 years of worshiping God, extending fellowship to one another, and reaching out to our wider community.

As I think back to those who have gone before us.... I think of all the friendships that were created, all the bonds that were formed, the visions these people had for this little church in the Northwoods. They loved God, and they loved each other. They served God by serving their community. And they created a church where EVERYONE was welcome and safe.

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES (DRAFT)

AUGUST 21, 2025 (Minutes are not yet approved by the council)

Present: Pastor Torri, Caryl Allan, Joni Kumpula, Linnea Dietrich, Mike Schmitt, Mary Parrish, Heidi and Don Hoppe, Connie Schmitt, Gunder Austin, Kerry Swenson, John and Tammy Lindberg, Fred Smith standing in for Marilyn McKnight, and Judy Hoopman

Call to Order by Moderator Gunder Austin, and Pastor Torri led us in prayer.

No changes to agenda, motion to accept agenda by Linnea and seconded by Connie, approved.

Motion to accept last month's minutes as presented made by Don and seconded by Joni, approved.

Old business:

Child Care Center -

- Connie is the new contact for the Child Care Center
- She and Ashley discussed changes in the contract.
- Ashley will purchase a washer & dryer with money from the Lions; Mike S and Kerry will work out details on installation
- Connie is in process of locating a copy of the original lease and will edit it to reflect the updated agreement
- Ashley informed Mike S about four lights flickering and bulbs needing to be replaced. This time Kerry will replace the bulbs, but this raised the question as to who (UCC or Child Care) is responsible for maintenance issues
- Connie will review what the current lease says and will let the Council know.

Policy on Events - This topic was tabled until further notice by Connie

New Business

New Council Format

- Gunder described the changes to the order of agenda items as an effort to streamline meetings
- New format will help in organizing reports by each team which will follow discussions of old and new business

Semi-Annual Meeting

- Discussion of receiving all reports for the semi-annual meeting ahead of time so information, especially in regard to nominations, can be provided to the congregation at the Sunday service one week prior to semi-annual meeting
- Reports will also be emailed to church members

Outreach Team

- Motion made to nominate Tammy Lindberg as team chair made by Heidi, seconded by Linnea and approved
- John Lindberg is now the vice moderator

Changes to Financial Stewardship Team

- Steve Erickson has stepped down as moderator and chair of Fundraising
- Discussion was brought to the Executive Committee, and a recommendation was made that the Board of Financial Stewardship agree to have Fundraising and Memorial Scholarship as subgroups.
- Connie made a motion to move fundraising and scholarship teams to a subgroup under Financial Stewardship, seconded by Don, approved
- Outreach funds earned will be kept separate since they are mostly used for community support of various groups/agencies Capital Campaign for Roof Project
 - Financial Stewardship recommends developing a specific team to move this project forward
 - Don is working on this and fundraising efforts for the rest of 2025, 2026, and 2027. The work will be done in 2026 with a
 projection of about \$150,000 needed.
 - Don suggests donations be referred to as special gifts to help the congregation understand the difference between regular monthly pledges to the congregation and additional financial supports or gifts for the capital roof campaign project
 - This will require congregation's approval

AED, CPR, First Aid Training

- Connie raised whether UCC may want to offer some form of First Aid training to our congregation.
- Kerry Swenson is a certified trainer and could do the training.
- Decision to offer the short course training to the congregation and if enough interest is shown, Kerry will plan for a half day training this fall.
- A sign-up sheet will be posted in the Fellowship Hall, and Sabbastian will make a slide for Sunday services

Pastor's Monthly Report:

- Children's Ministry will start September 14; Sue Kimmel and Robin Wicker will teach
- "Bible and Beer" is a bible study offered at Rendezvous Brewery starting Monday, September 15 at 4pm and will continue for several consecutive weeks.
- Update on the Minnesota United Church of Christ annual conference; there is a new conference Minister as of November 1, Torri has been selected as the chairperson for the 2026 annual conference
- Sabbastian is working on developing a web page for rental of church facilities.

Board of Facilities:

- Kerry moved the pew as previously discussed
- Kerry and John have been fixing walls, painting, cleaning and general maintenance in the sanctuary
- Follow up regarding contacting Gull Lake Glass about replacing church doors is needed

Board of Financial Stewardship:

- Income and expenses for July were about normal
- The site prep for the Solar Array was done in June, and the solar array was completed and began functioning on July 31.
 UCC should be receiving a grant for \$5000 from Minnesota Power for the project. The team is working on a 30% refund for the project
- Letters and pledge cards for the 2026 Stewardship will be handed out this Sunday, and the remainder will be mailed next week.
- Men's Fellowship is going to terminate its checking account and will have its finances handled through Union's financial
 accounts.

Board of Personnel

- Connie updated the Council about the procedure for criminal background checks for volunteers for the Children's Sunday School service. Background checks are good for two years.
- Connie introduced a form she developed to help organize and improve the flow for team reports for Council meeting.

Adult Learning:

• Spirits and Spirituality workshop is scheduled for Wednesday, August 27 in the Fellowship Hall from 4:00 to 6:00pm

Congregational Life:

Caryl stated all is well, no specific news to share, and the congregation continues to support those in need.

Justice Ministry: Fred Smith presented in Marilyn's absence

- Marilyn is the new contact for this team
- Justice Ministry meets the first Thursday of the month by Zoom, and interested people should contact Marilyn marilyn@ericksonmediation.com
- Presentation scheduled soon in the Fellowship Hall by Obie Ballenger about the LGBT/JMT Action Plans
- Leech Lake Culture Alliance Potluck: August 18th 6:00pm at Onigum
- Izaak Walton League Spaghetti Dinner in planning for November
- Pride events happening 8-23 in Bemidji, 9-13 in Brainerd, and JMT is working on a gathering in our area in September
- Don informed the Council about a woman who has researched segregation in the Minneapolis schools, is writing a book about effects of herbicides, and will be presenting at UCC when the Izaak Walton League holds its spaghetti dinner as related to JMT environmental goals.

Men's Fellowship:

- Don is the team leader until November
- Men's Fellowship meets on the 2nd Monday each month at 9am. Meet at UCC to carpool to the Corner Store for breakfast
- Mike S is planning a presentation for Men's Fellowship on Cell Phone use

Outreach Team

- On August 5th Outreach helped at the hotdog stand for the kids fishing contest
- On August 20th a community meal was held at UCC with freewill donations going to the Lending Library. The donations totaled \$1,457, and after expenses the Lending Library received \$1,261
- September community meal will support the Hackensack Food Shelf

Tech Team:

- In September Mike will provide a detailed report of how the Solar Array is working
- The team is focusing on the sound system in the sanctuary
- No immediate plans for a tech sale but Mike is willing to take items as donations, and he has several laptop computers and TVs for sale. Donations will help support the Child Care Facility

Women's Fellowship:

- There were 22 participants for the napkin folding event
- There has been a lot of positive response for the appetizer recipes, and Sabbastian is working on the recipe collection
- Next month's event: Bring an appetizer, enjoy a glass of wine, and learn about "Happy Hour"

Worship:

- July averaged 52 participants each Sunday at UCC and 8 households online; August averaged 50 each Sunday
- Choir singing at UCC this Sunday 8-24-25
- When there are 5 Sundays in a month, the 5th Sunday will be dedicated to singing our favorite hymns
- Connie shared a new logo for the church, and it will be used during the Lion's 50th anniversary celebration

THROUGH KODA'S EYES


A Conversation with Bandit (the Cat)

Summary

Income and expenses for July were about normal. Our current expenses and giving are below our budgeted amounts. We are concerned that our giving and other revenue for 2025 will be less than our expenses.

The site prep for the solar array was done in June, and the solar array was completed and began functioning on July 31.

Letters and pledge cards for the 2026 Stewardship Campaign were handed out Sunday, August 24, and the remainder mailed the next day. Please prayerfully consider your giving and pledge for 2026 and give generously.

After discussion in the July council meeting and a recommendation from the Executive Committee, the Board of Financial Stewardship agreed to have Fundraising and Memorial Scholarship be subgroups of BFS. The Church Council approved this change at their August meeting.

A capital campaign to cover expenses for the re-shingling of the church will be started this year. We hope to have a plan at the September council meeting for approval.

Men's Fellowship is going to terminate its checking account and will have its finances handled through Union Church's financial account system.

Sunday School is starting in September!!!

Starting September 14^{th} children will be dismissed after the "Passing of the Peace" for Sunday School. NEWS FROM THE WORSHIP MINISTRY TEAM



Lectio Divina continues on Wednesday's 4-5 PM. Questions? Please reach out to Linnea Dietrich, 612-810-3407.







MEN'S FELLOWSHIP


