Notes from Rev. Torri Vande Zande

Advent: The Season of Waiting! (Which I'm not very good at.)

The day after Thanksgiving was the time my family put up our Christmas tree every year. We had an artificial tree we would drag down from the second floor storage room and plop it down in the middle of the living room. We also had two or three large boxes packed with ornaments, garland, tinsel, and lights.

As we began to put up the tree, we worked together like a well-oiled machine. My mom would organize the branches, and I would put them in the long wooden stick. Once all the branches were in... well, not all the branches because one was missing... We moved on to filtering through the ornaments and deciding which ones we wanted on the tree that year. Meanwhile, my brother wrestled with untangling the lights and made sure all the bulbs worked. He hated this job and often cussed a lot. In the midst of the mess we would always manage to break one or two ornaments, throw out at least a half a dozen bulbs, and fight over whether or not we wanted the tree to "blink." Maybe "a well-oiled machine" aren't the right words to describe us.

In the end, empty boxes that once held all the decorations were littered throughout the house, and countless ornament hooks were lost in the carpet. It was a lot of work to get ready for Christmas! But in the midst of our mess... we were ready!

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

NOVEMBER, 20 2025

Present: Pastor Torri by Zoom, Caryl Allan, Joni Kumpula, Mike Schmitt, Heidi and Don Hoppe, Connie Schmitt, John and Tammy Lindberg, Mike Bohanon, Kerry Swenson, Linnea Dietrich, Sheryl Kaubisch, Marilyn Erickson, and Judy Hoopman Call to Order by Vice Moderator, John Lindberg, and Pastor Torri led us in prayer.

No change to the agenda. Motion to accept agenda by Linnea and seconded by Mike, approved.

Last month's (October) minutes were reviewed electronically by the Council and have been approved by email. An official copy was submitted for the November newsletter.

OLD BUSINESS

2026 Budget Update & cost projection – Don informed Council that forms to members of the Council and Ministry Teams have been sent out regarding budget expectations for 2026 and past information on 2025 expenses. They are due by December 2^{nd} so the budget can be reviewed in the December Executive Committee meeting to plan for the 2026 budget.

Policy & Procedure Manual – Connie previously handed out forms to the Council and Ministry Teams for review and updating. Forms are needed from Worship and Finances by December 2nd for the December Executive meeting for review and editing.

Training of Cooking Staff - Contact has been made with the Salvation Army which has a food truck and charges no fee for ServSafe training. Kerry is looking into them coming here for this training. Once trained, the expectation is that those trained will be available to help the Salvation Army in the future. Mike and Kerry have been involved, and they are the contact for Salvation Army.

Sponsorship of Benefit Meals - Tammy, John, and Pastor Torri are working on this. Some contact has been made with local businesses. They may not be able to donate every month, but they have offered to help with the purchases of certain items at their cost through their suppliers.

Child Care Locks for Play Ground - Connie has been working on this, and Mike B offered to provide several padlocks to resolve this issue.

NEW BUSINESS

Treasurer Report from Sheryl - Sheryl brought up issues with getting bills paid and outlined the general procedure to be followed. Bills need to be mailed to UCC's P.O. box not the street address of the church. Original receipts need to be submitted along with the voucher form and approved/signed by Ministry/committee chair. Snow plowing is arranged for winter with Colter Peterson. Event Policy – Connie provided a policy draft for review with discussion following. She explained the recommendation of not covering UCC's symbols when events are occurring. Exception to this would be for special events such as Dinner and Show. With new staging material, the cross and altar could be covered. Council supports this, and a motion to accept the policy was made by Kerry, seconded by Heidi and approved. Connie will update the final version to include this rider.

Church Projects - Connie has been working on compiling a list of necessary projects with the top three being:

- 1. The church roof waiting for information about insurance,
- 2. Foundation Issues Kerry has had contact with the architecture agency of Widseth who bought out the original company of Architecture 1 that did the initial work when the Fellowship Hall was added. The company suggested not doing anything until they send their engineers to review the wall and foundation. Discussion by Council included consulting with an attorney or Steve Erickson who has mediated several of these situations. We are waiting to hear back from insurance and having the Widseth engineers come and look at the foundation and wall.
- 3. Financial System used for church accounting is QuickBooks and "Church Windows." Mike and Connie Schmitt will meet with users and do a discovery session needs assessment. Other potential projects mentioned: Church freezer, update thermostats, light bulb replacements, circuit needed for Child Care washer & dryer, painting the bell tower, carpet upgrade, and altar facelift. Raise the Roof Campaign Don's update On hold until January and 2026 budget is set. AED, CPR, First Aid Training Kerry Swenson provided an excellent training session, and it was well attended. REPORTS

Pastor's Monthly Report: Pastor Torri provided a written report. Council acknowledged Pastor's recent article in the newsletter about "Under the Roof" and future utility of it.

Board of Facilities – Mike and Kerry stated basic church maintenance is up to date, and they are working to correct issues with the heat pump for the library.

Board of Financial Stewardship: Don provided a grim report of current finances with expenses exceeding income for last month. Income for October was low, and expenses were very high. If all 2025 pledges are completed by the end of the year, we will still have a deficit of up to \$20,000 to \$30,000. This also means there will be no carryover to assist with the 2026 budget. The 2026 Stewardship Campaign continues with 43 pledges received totaling \$92,917. We are hopeful for at least 5 more pledges with a possible total of 48 pledges and a projected total of \$120,000. Don and Financial Stewardship will continue to work on the 2026 budget in December. There was also more discussion about the roof issue and the possibility of Roof Max spraying the shingles for 25% of the cost of total reroofing project. This spraying could last for about 5 years which may provide time for the church to have enough money to reroof. No firm decision was made as nothing can be done now until spring. More information will be gathered.

Board of Personnel: Connie brought up the 2026 state mandate for Minnesota Leave Policy and is researching how this may affect the church employees and budgets.

Adult Learning: Linnea provided information about a 3-session training event "Living Deeply, Dying Well" on Health Care Directives and end of life issues by Laurel Riedel to be offered January 5,12, and February 9 from 10-11:30 at UCC. There is a fee of \$75, and registration is limited to 10 participants. If there is enough interest, this could be offered again in the spring. Laura Baum-Parr will be offering a ½ day retreat on compassion on Saturday, January 24th from 9-noon in the Fellowship Hall.

Congregational Life:

Pastor Torri provided a written report that included creating a Called to Care team of 10 regular people and several others as needed. She also mentioned that we are updating the church directory and reviewing the current copy, updating as needed.

Justice Ministry:

Book study is on hold until after the holidays and is planned to start in January. Several individuals will attend a training about ICE in Minneapolis on December 14. If interested in attending, contact Marilyn Erickson.

Men's Fellowship:

Mike S. stated a good meeting was held at the Corner Store café with 9 participants. Next meeting will be at Hackensack's Blue Ox Coffee Shop on Monday, December 8th at 9:30. November's Community Meal was well attended and earned \$487 for the food boxes that Men's Fellowship prepares for Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter with the Food Shelf. Quilt placemats were donated from the Heartland Quilters and will be added to the food boxes. Monday 11/24 food boxes will be prepared for distribution to 15 families.

Outreach Team: Tammy confirmed what Men's Fellowship shared about the recent community meal. Planning is in process for future events and fundraisers such as dinner and music in the Fellowship Hall, and a silent auction event.

Tech Team: Tech Team has a surplus of TV's and computers that will be up for sale this Saturday 11/22 from 10 AM to 1 PM in the Fellowship Hall.

Women's Fellowship: Joni is passing on her role as chairperson to Sherry Toenjes. A warm applause for all of Joni's hard work was given. The Cookie and Craft Sale will be held on Sunday December 7th in the Fellowship Hall. Joni asked that cookies by the half dozen be donated and will be sold for \$3.00 for each plate.

There is no Women's Fellowship gathering in January, and the February meeting will be for planning 2026 activities. The next event will be the annual Women's Fellowship sponsored Christmas luncheon on 12/11 in the Fellowship Hall at noon with food provided by The Big Dipper. This annual event is open to all members and friends of Union Church. (Please respond on the sign-up sheet in the hallway if you plan to attend so we can get a good idea of numbers...it is paid for and served by Women's Fellowship.)

Bone Builders continue to go very well, and there will no longer be any field trips through Women's Fellowship due to low participation.

Worship: Heidi stated since November 30th is a 5th Sunday, there will be a hymn sing, and the service will also be the 1st in the Advent season. For Advent the Wednesday services will be shared with St. Paul's Lutheran and the Lighthouse with soup dinners following. Christmas Eve service will be at 4PM, and a notice will go into the local paper. Pastor Torri will be on vacation from December 25 to January 1. Truett Lawson will give the message, and Tom Cox will assist as worship leader.

Moderator's Moment: John acknowledges everyone's efforts and work with a warm thank you to all.

Pastor closed the meeting with the benediction and a prayer for Gunder and his brother who is in failing health.

Next meeting will be January 15, 2026

Team reports due January 12, 2026.

No Council Meeting in December and no newsletter in January 2026.

Summary

Income for October was low, and expenses again were very high. If all 2025 pledges are completed by the end of the year, we will still have a deficit of \$20,000 to \$30,000 unless we receive additional donations. This also means that there will be no carryover to assist with the 2026 budget.

The 2026 Stewardship Campaign is continuing and currently we have received 43 pledges for a total of \$92,917. We are contacting previous pledging units and hope for at least another 5 pledges. Our hope was to receive 48 pledges for a total of \$120,000.

We are working on the 2026 budget. This will be presented at the Semi-annual meeting at the end of January.

A capital campaign for the roof project will begin in January, 2026. The Church Council is also discussing other facilities and operating expenditures and the sustainability of Union Church.

DINNER AND A SHOW!


FROST AND FLANNEL




